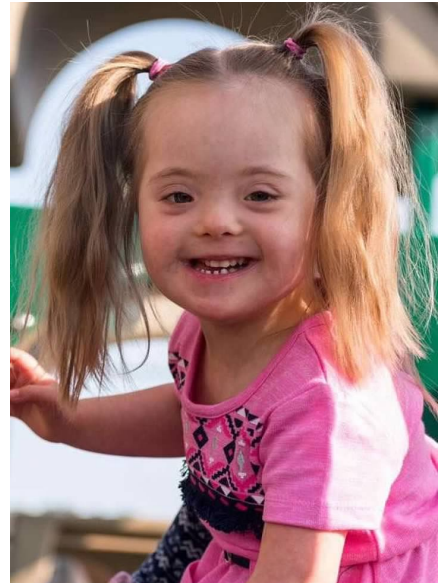

Featuring local speakers that explore topics ranging from educational advocacy to new research in Down syndrome.

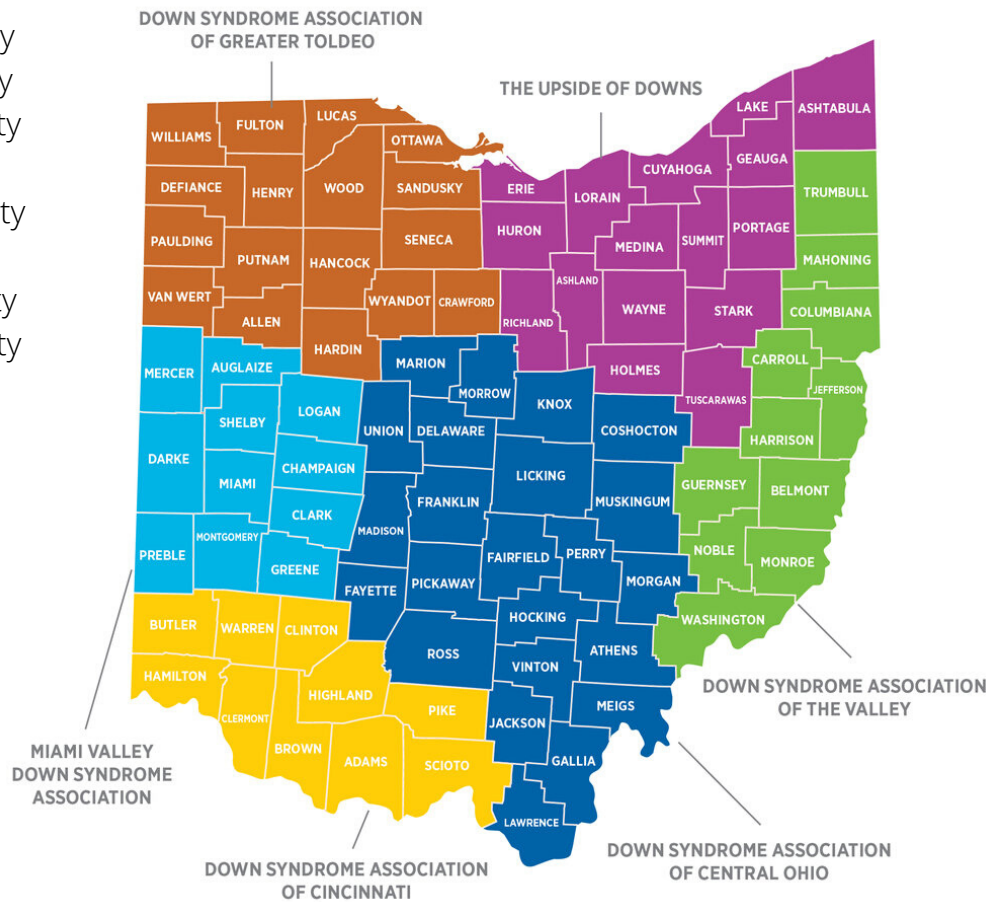

The Learning Program

The Learning Program is an educational program for students with Down syndrome and their parents. The program supplements formal education through direct instruction to parents and students and monthly home-use materials. With a focus on literacy, math, communication and fine motor skill development, The Learning Program seeks to empower parents as first teachers and improve academic outcomes for students with Down syndrome.

Scholarships

DSAGT offers a maximum one-time per year \$100 scholarship to individuals with Down syndrome to attend a camp or recreational, therapeutic or educational program of their choice.

Down with the Beat: Music and Movement

DSAGT is partnering with BelInstrumental to provide a music and movement class for little ones with Down syndrome between the ages of 1 and 4. The class will focus on the benefits of music therapy and work on gross and fine motor skills.

Teen & Young Adult Dances

Once a quarter our teens and young adults come together for a festive dance. They are treated to pizza and dessert and a night of dancing with friends. It also provides a night for parents to meet and build connections.

Family Outings

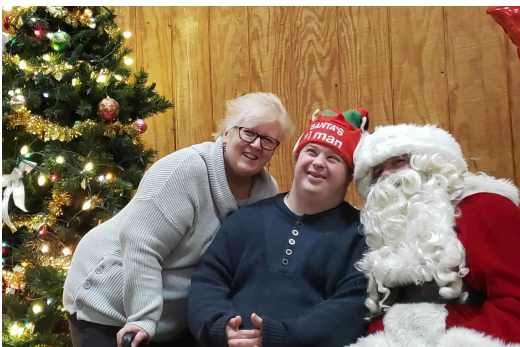
Our families enjoy 3 outings each year these include: a Toledo Walleye game, Toledo Mudhens game, and a day at the pumpkin patch. It provides families an opportunity to get to know each other and provides community awareness for DSAGT.

DSAGT Holiday Party

Families come together to celebrate the holiday season. Each guest will enjoy a warm lunchtime meal, dancing to DJ music, seeing old friends and meeting new ones, as well as a visit from Santa Claus. Each person who visits with Santa will receive a small gift from Santa.

Smart Start

Smart Start is a program designed for Kindergarten readiness. It allows parents of pre-k children with Down syndrome to attend four sessions each addressing a relevant topic to starting school. The sessions include: IEP's, Relationships with educators, Potty training and friendships.

Down Syndrome Awareness Book Bundles

As part of our efforts to celebrate and promote October as Down Syndrome Awareness month, DSAGT provides "Book bundles" to schools throughout the DSAGT service area. Bundles include several age appropriate books along with some informational materials and DSAGT logo items.

Educational Seminars and Lectures

DSAGT works to educate families, medical professionals, and community members on current and up-to-date topics about Down syndrome through educational seminars and lectures. They cover topics anywhere from IEPs and educational advocacy to the latest research in health and behavioral science.
